luxury hotels, and then there are small boutiques and B&Bs. All can be five-star and offer a complete menu of luxurious perks. While the larger properties are often part of a top-name chain with a long list of amenities, most boutiques are individually-owned and, due to the smaller number of guests, are able to connect with you more personally, more quickly. The décor is decidedly individual, usually reflecting the area's historical ambience blended with the decorative ideas of the owners and their professional designers.

As this issue is dedicated to things artistic, we decided to check out some of SoCal's artsy boutique properties and discovered a considerable selection of excellent, individually-designed smaller hotels providing distinctive character, laid-back sophistication and all the amenities required to make your getaway totally terrific.



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LAGUNA BEACH





were restored to their original Mission-style and Casa Laguna was named a "Registered Historic Structure" by the City of Laguna Beach. In 2014, it was purchased by a PRG partnership that restored the Spanish Colonial architecture and redesigned the inn as a luxury boutique hotel. Designer Martyn Lawrence Bullard oversaw an extensive restoration of the 23 guest rooms and lobby and in April 2016, the hotel reopened with Moorish tiles and ceramics complementing custom fabric prints and an eclectic array of furnishings. The striking spa features indoor and outdoor services, and in addition to a spa menu, Casa Laguna offers a daily complimentary continental breakfast featuring homemade breads and pastries, muffins, and quiches. → In downtown Palm Springs is **HOLIDAY HOUSE PALM SPRINGS**, a 28-room, adults-only boutique hotel designed by renowned architect Herbert W. Burns, a leading influencer in creating the iconic Palm Springs mid-century modern style. When Holiday House opened in 1951, it was known as the newest luxury hotel in Palm Springs and for years catered to an exclusive clientele.

After numerous ownership changes, Holiday House Palm Springs re-opened in 2017 after being reconceived by a team headed noted interior designer Mark D. Sikes. Today, the property embodies its original spirit with mid-century-inspired elements accented by whimsical touches. Throughout are various works of art including some by David Hockney, Roy Liechtenstein, Herb Ritts, Alex Katz and Mr. Brainwash, and a garden sculpture by Donald Sultan.

To encourage the communal environment, there's a lovely pool, shuffleboard court and lots of outdoor seating. None of the guest rooms have TVs or phones. Each is limited to two guests and has been totally redone with oversized showers, custom textiles, curated art collection, and extensive mini bar. The Pantry, open daily from 11 am – 4 pm, features simple breakfast, lunch and brunch menus. The bar remains open until 11 pm nightly.
